Students can apply for individual accommodations for everyday student life based on illness, disability or other specific needs, whether temporary or chronic. This accommodation shall compensate for any disadvantage caused by illness or disability, so that the student is able to study on approximately equal terms as her/his fellow students. However, the right to accommodations is applicable as long as it does not place a disproportionate burden on the institution. The accommodations must not lead to a reduction of the academic requirements of a course or the study program.

In addition to submitting the application form, the needs for accommodation must be documented by a GP or health professional. It is, however, up to the Department of Academic Affairs to determine what kind of accommodation MF can provide.

Examples of reasons for accommodation:

- Dyslexia
- Illness
- Medication
- Pregnancy/breastfeeding
- Physical or psychosocial impairment
- Other causes of work/study impairment

Examples of different kinds of accommodation:

- Extended deadlines
- Extended time for study requirements
- Study desk
- Absence
